



SailGP WASZP Season 5 Grand Final Qualification Document

The Season 5 Grand Final for WASZP is anticipated to take place in Sydney in early 2026.

1. Eligibility

- Men shall be under 25 on 31 December 2025
- There is no age limit for women
- Nationality restrictions are highlighted in Appendix 1
- National Class Associations may require sailors to apply to be considered for qualification providing adequate notice is given and there is no application cost to the sailor

2. The Grand Final

- The top ranked eligible sailor from the qualifying event(s) will be awarded a place at the SailGP WASZP Season 5 Grand Final
- A sailor may only qualify once for the Grand Final
- Where a sailor turns down a place for the Grand Final, the place will be offered to the next best sailor of the relevant nationality from the qualifying event(s)

The table below outlines the Qualifying Events and the country in which those events will be held; the number of qualifying places at each event(s) and the nationalities that qualification is available to.

Appendix 2: Qualifying Criteria by event

- 1. Women's Qualification (see also Australian Qualification):
- 1.1 Event: Women's Sprint Champs (19/20 July Weymouth, UK)
- 1.2 The event is open to women from any nation.
- 1.3 The top two eligible boats at the Women's Sprint Champs will be awarded places for the Grand Final.
- 2. French Qualification:
- 2.1 Event: SailGP Slalom at the French Nationals (4-8 July, Carnac, France)
- 2.2 This event is separate from the French Nationals.
- 2.3 This qualifying spot is open to French sailors only.
- 2.4 Up to 24 athletes will compete in the Slalom event.
- 2.5 The top eligible boat from the Slalom event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 3. Spanish Qualification:
- 2.1 Event: Spanish SailGP Qualifier (September, TBC)
- 2.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from Spain and Portugal only.
- 2.3 The top eligible boat from the event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 3. German Qualification:
- 3.1 Events: German Open (30 May -1 June, Flensburger Segel-Club) and WASZP Games (19-25 July, Weymouth, UK).
- 3.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from Germany, Netherlands and Czech Republic only.
- 3.3 The top eligible boat with the highest combined score from the qualifying events in accordance with the table below will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 3.4 The rank at each event is the rank of eligible sailors only not the overall finishing position of the boat.

- 4. American Qualification:
- 4.1 Event: US Nationals (2-4 May, Annapolis)
- 4.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from the USA and any Caribbean Island nation only.
- 4.3 The top eligible boat from the event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 5. Canadian Qualification:
- 5.1 Event: Canadian Nationals (10-12 October, Halifax)
- 5.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from Canada only.
- 5.3 The top eligible boat from the event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 6. Swiss Qualification:
- 6.1 Events: Hugo EuroCup Switzerland (9-11 May, Geneva) and WASZP Games (19-25 July, Weymouth, UK).
- 6.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from Switzerland only.
- 6.3 The top eligible boat with the highest combined score from the qualifying events in accordance with the table below will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 6.4 The rank at each event is the rank of eligible sailors only not the overall finishing position of the boat.

- 7. Scandinavian Qualification:
- 7.1 Events: Nordic Championship (8-10 August, Oslo) and EuroCup Sweden (12-14 September, GKSS)
- 7.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from Denmark, Norway and Sweden only.
- 7.3 The eligible boat with the lowest sum of its rankings from both qualifying events will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 8. Italian Qualifier
- 8.1 Events: All Italia Cup events
- 8.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from Italy, Slovenia and Greece only.
- 8.3 The top eligible boat in the Italia Cup rankings 2025 will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.

- 9. UK Qualifier
- 9.1 Event: WASZP Games (19-25 July, Weymouth).
- 9.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from UK, Ireland and Bermuda
- 9.3 The top eligible boat at the event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 10. Australian Qualifier:
- 10.1 Event: Australian National Sprint Championship (December, Geelong, Australia).
- 10.2 The men's qualifying spot is open to sailors from Australia and Asia only. The women's qualifying spot is open to women from any nation.
- 10.3 The top eligible man and woman from the qualifying event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 11. New Zealand Qualifier
- 11.1 Event: NZ SailGP Qualifier (17-18 January, Murray's Bay).
- 11.2 This qualifying spot is open to sailors from New Zealand only.
- 11.3 The top eligible boat in the event will be awarded a place for the Grand Final.
- 11.4 The NZ class association will run preliminary events to the final qualifier.
